- All submitted documents must arrive at the Office of International Affairs by the due deadline, based on Korean Standard Time (KST).
- Documents submitted after the deadline will not be accepted. Failure to submit the required documents may result in a disadvantage during the screening process.
- If the submitted documents fail to arrive by the deadline due to postal delays, accidents, or any other reason, the applicant may be disqualified. The applicant is responsible for this outcome (application fee is non-refundable).
- After submitting the application, modification of the application is not possible. The applicant is responsible for any consequences resulting from errors in the information provided.
- Please ensure that personal information such as name, date of birth, address, phone number, and email address are entered correctly.
- All necessary notifications during the screening period will be sent to the applicant's e-mail address. Applicants must ensure their email address is accurately entered on the application form, as the applicant is responsible for any disadvantages resulting from incorrect contact information or an inability to reach them.
- Tuition payment will only be recognized if the full tuition amount is deposited into the bank account of the University of Suwon by the deadline, based on Korean Standard Time (KST).
- Even if a transfer is initiated from overseas during the payment period, the applicant will be considered unregistered if the tuition fee does not arrive by the final payment deadline.

※ Notes for Transfer Students

- Transfer students will be automatically assigned to the major they applied for upon admission.

- All transfer applicants must pay attention to and apply with the understanding that graduating within the standard study period may be difficult in the following cases:
 - 1) If the admitted major is different from the previous university major.
 - 2) If transfer credits are not fully recognized due to low similarity between the courses completed at the previous university and those required by the new major.
 - 3) If the student is required to complete additional mandatory courses based on the result of the transfer credit evaluation.

3 Application Requirements

» 3-1. Nationality and Education

◎ Nationality: Applicants whose parent(s) and the applicant all hold foreign nationality

- Ineligible for application: Individuals who, or whose parent(s), hold Korean nationality (including dual citizenship holders)

※ Notes on Nationality

- If the applicant and the applicant's parents have a foreign citizenship before the applicant enrolls in a high school curriculum in Korea, the applicant will be recognized as a foreign national.
- If the applicant is supported by only one of the parents, the nationality of the parent will be recognized for the eligibility for assistance. However, this must be confirmed by a government issued documentation.
- If the applicant or either parent holds Korean nationality or dual citizenship, the applicant is ineligible to apply.
- If the applicant is found to hold Korean nationality or dual citizenship after admission, the admission acceptance will be revoked.
- If there are any special circumstance related to the applicant's family relations and nationality (e.g., divorce, remarriage, death, disappearance, acquisition of Korean nationality, etc.), a government issued documentation must be provided.

※ Notes on Education

- Schools in Korea and foreign schools in accordance to their relevant national education laws and regulations will be recognized.
- Other educational qualifications such as GED, homeschooling, and cyber learning will not be recognized.
- For transferring applicants, all formal documentation such as academic regulations, credits earned, grades, and graduation requirements must be submitted.

※ Notes on Related Majors

- A "related major" refers to a major whose title may differ but whose curriculum substantially overlaps with or is closely connected to the applied major, allowing the applicant to be recognized as having the same or similar academic expertise, as determined by each department (major).

※ **Notes on Document Submission**

- 1) All documents must be submitted in original form, and submitted documents will not be returned under any circumstances.
- 2) Both the online application and offline documents must be submitted by the deadline.
- 3) All documents must be submitted by the deadline stated in the admission guidelines, based on Korean Standard Time (KST).
- 4) All documents must be prepared in Korean or English. If they are in another language, a notarized Korean or English translation must be submitted.
- 5) The applicant is responsible for any disadvantages caused by incorrect or incomplete information on the application form or failure to respond to communications from the university.
- 6) Academic documents are only accepted if issued within six months from the start date of the application period.
- 7) Graduation and transcript documents issued by foreign schools **must be notarized with a Korean or English translation.**
- 8) All certificates issued by foreign institutions must be accompanied by an **Apostille Certificate** issued by the designated government authority of the school's country, or a **Consular Confirmation/Verification Certificate** issued by a Korean Embassy or Consulate in that country.
- 9) When applying for transfer admission, applicants must submit supporting documents on their previous institution's academic regulations, including graduation credit requirements, completed semesters, and grading policies, and all course titles completed at the previous institution must be translated into Korean.
- 10) Failure to submit the original documents within the designated period, or any discrepancy between submitted copies and originals, will result in revocation of admission.
- 11) Admission will be revoked if it is found that the applicant has been admitted through fraudulent means (e.g., forged documents, falsified qualifications, proxy testing) either before or after enrollment. In such cases, tuition and fees already paid will not be refunded.
- 12) Applicants expecting to graduate must submit final graduation and transcript certificates within the submission deadline set by the university.
- 13) Failure to submit the final graduation (or completion) documents by the deadline will result in revocation of admission.
- 14) If, due to a country's or institution's academic system, semester-by-semester or yearly transcripts cannot be issued, the Office of International Affairs may request additional documents or evidence.
- 15) Even if all required documents listed in Section 5 (Required Documents) on pages 13~14 of the University of Suwon International Admissions Guidelines have been submitted, applicants who are requested to provide additional documents must submit them within the designated deadline.
- 16) Failure to submit required supporting documents on time, resulting in visa issuance delays, may lead to cancellation of admission.
- 17) Only language test scores valid during the application period will be accepted.
- 18) As all submitted documents are non-returnable, applicants are strongly advised to prepare extra copies of important documents in advance for future visa application purposes.

- For transfer students, tuition fees may vary depending on the department of admission.
- Final successful applicants must pay the tuition fee within the designated payment period.
- Failure to do so will result in cancellation of admission. If tuition is not paid by the payment deadline, the applicant will be regarded as having withdrawn from admission.
- For payments remitted from overseas, the tuition fee must arrive at the university by the payment deadline; otherwise, the applicant will be considered unregistered.
- If an applicant withdraws after paying tuition, a refund will be made in accordance with the university's tuition refund policy.
- If any submitted documents are found to be falsified or if admission was obtained through dishonest means, the admission will be revoked even after enrollment, and no tuition refund will be granted.

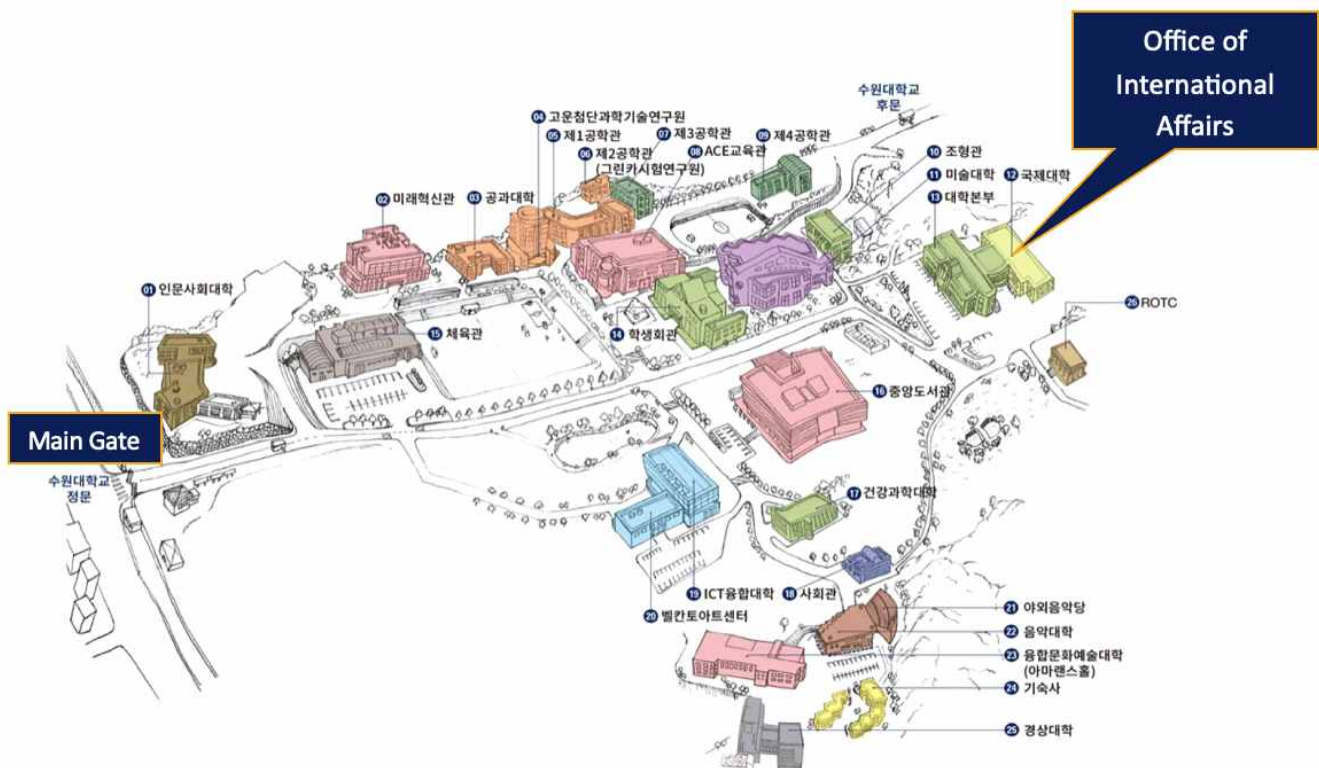
